Access to Higher Education

Looking to go to university? Our Access to HE courses get you there in one year.

Professional

Whether you are training for a specialist role in accounting, HR, management or procurement, our professional courses are what you need to succeed.

Adult Courses and Skills

Our adult courses are ideal if you are looking to change career, refresh your industry skills or develop your English, maths, digital or IT skills.

Leisure Courses

English for Speakers of Other Languages (ESOL)

GCSEs

Course Fees and Funding

Course fees vary - please see your chosen course for details. For long courses and courses over £100, you can pay via an instalment plan to spread the cost.

If you are not eligible for free tuition, full fees are payable.

For learners aged 19+ many of our courses may be free if any of the following apply:

Level 3 Free Courses for Jobs

If you don't hold a full Level 3 qualification* (equivalent to 2 A Levels), you can now study certain Level 3 courses for free – thanks to the Government's Free Courses for Jobs programme. If you are earning below £25,750 or are unemployed, you may also qualify.

***West Yorkshire residents only; residents of other non-devolved areas who do not hold a full Level 3 qualification, do not earn below £25,750 and are not unemployed, must be aged 19-23 on 31st August 2025.**





Advanced Learner Loan

Where fees are due, an Advanced Learner Loan can help cover part or all of your course fees and provide financial support while you study.

You can apply for an Advanced Learner Loan if you are:

Aged 19 or over

A UK resident

Accepted on to an eligible course at Level 3

The minimum you can borrow is £300 and the maximum depends on the fees for your course. Once your offer has been confirmed and you have received our learning and funding information letter, you can register and apply for a loan online. You need to have an approved Advanced Learner Loan in place before you enrol. If you don't, you will need to discuss your options with us at enrolment.

You do not need to pay your loan back until:

**You have finished
your course**

**You earn £524 a week, £2,274
a month or £27,295 a year**

Loan repayment is at a low rate and on a 30 year term, making it more manageable for you. Plus, if you get a loan to cover tuition fees for an Access to HE course and go on to study a degree, your loan will be written off. Bursaries may be available. Instalment plan

If you choose not to take out an approved Advanced Learner Loan, or the qualification is not eligible for other public funding, you may be able to pay using an instalment plan. The minimum course fee eligible for instalments is £100.

You will pay 25% of your course fees at enrolment and the remainder will be spread between one and six months, depending on your requirements and the length of your chosen course.

All fees must be paid in full one month before the end of the course. Full details of the college's fees policy are available at our website – leedscitycollege.ac.uk

Financial support

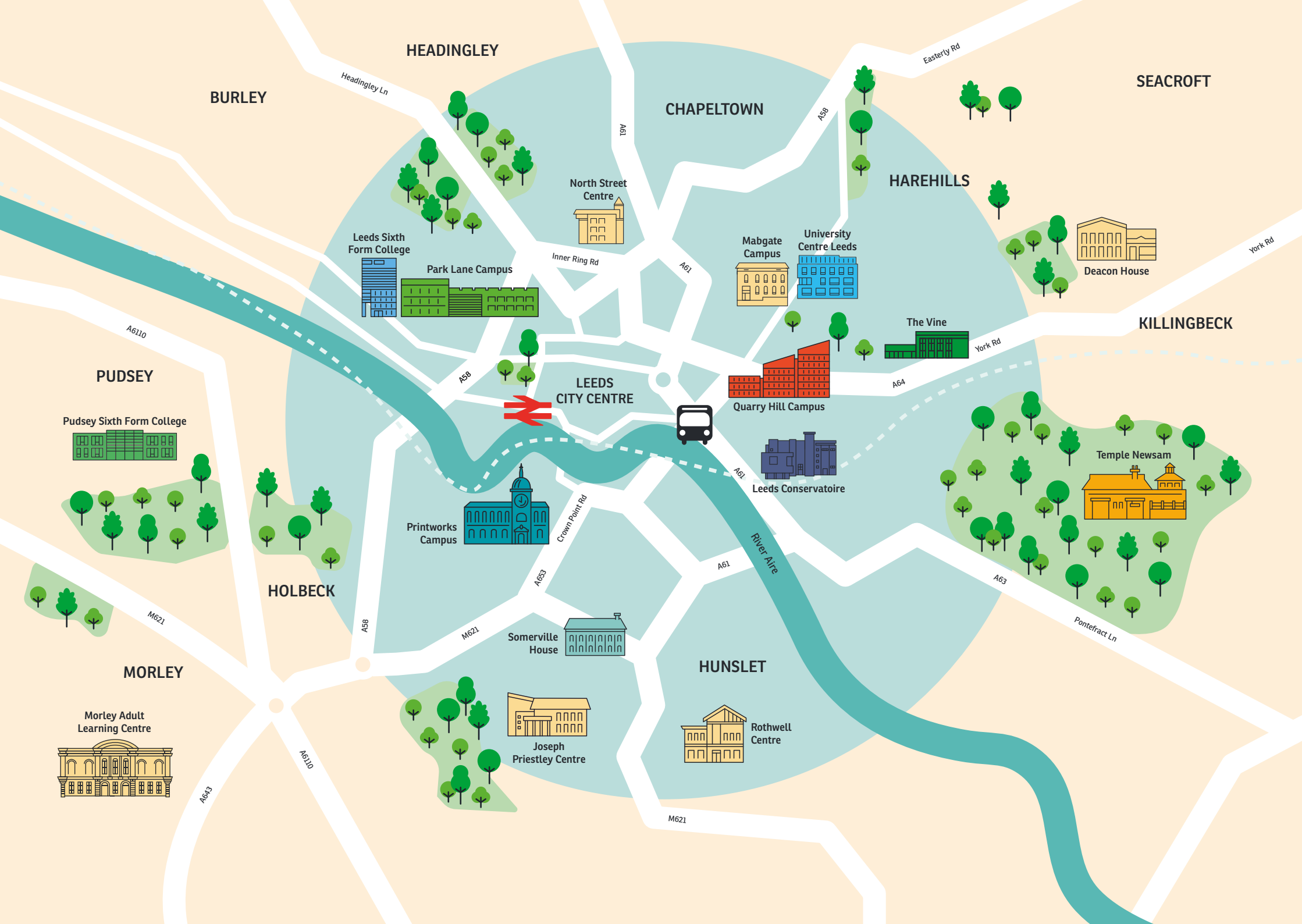

Access to HE Art and Design

Level 3 Diploma

Start date: September

Study: Full time, taught onsite two days per week

Duration: 1 year

Location: Quarry Hill Campus

This qualification is the perfect stepping stone to a creative degree at university. Cultivate specialist skills and creative ways of working and thinking independently, in a supportive studio environment. Be encouraged and nurtured to explore your critical thinking skills and contextual referencing which will stand you in good stead for university.

Through a combination of studio-based and online learning you will develop your creative practice, hone your style and work towards a final project in which you prepare for exhibition.

Progression routes may include a relevant creative arts degree.



Access to HE Computer Games

Level 3 Diploma

Study: Full time, taught onsite 2 days per week

Duration: 1 year

Location: Quarry Hill Campus

If you're interested in the computer games industry and want to take your knowledge of gaming to the next level, this course is an excellent platform from which to progress to further study.

You will gain a grounding in computer games development covering the fundamentals such as 3D modelling, programming, concept art and web development. Alongside subject specific knowledge, you will develop crucial skills in preparation for studying at university such as academic writing, referencing and research.

Following successful completion of this course students can progress to university to study a degree in related games subjects.

Access to HE Creative Industries

This one-year, fast-tracked course is ideal for creative adults with a passion for media. Develop specialist skills in television, film and journalism while also improving your academic skills in preparation for university.

You will learn and develop skills and techniques in your specialist subject, from an experienced and passionate team of teachers and experts who work in the industry. You will learn how to form crews to plan, film and edit your own film productions and will gain industry insight and develop a professional approach to media production and the industry.

Progression may include creative degrees such as media studies, media production, digital media, film, television, journalism and marketing.

Covering psychology, sociology and social policy, the course also allows you to choose from modules allowing you to tailor the course to your particular area of interest. Example units include crime and deviance, psychology and social work.

This access course gives you the foundational knowledge in psychology, sociology, criminology and social policy enabling you to pursue a degree in social science at university.

This Access to HE engineering science diploma will prepare you for a variety of engineering qualifications.

You will broaden your knowledge in multiple areas of engineering, such as mechanical, medical and electrical. The course will see you develop your maths, physics, engineering and academic skills, while learning about electricity and electromagnetism, calculus, and waves and optics. You will also conduct a design project within an engineering context.

Ideally placed for anyone looking to study engineering, completion of this course paves the way for learning at a higher level. Progression includes undertaking qualifications such as Electrical and Electronic Engineering HNC/D; Manufacturing Engineering HNC/D; or a Leadership and Management (Engineering) foundation degree.

Access to Environmental and Climate Science

Level 3 Diploma

Start date: September

Study: Full time

Duration: 1 year

Location: Park Lane Campus

Are you interested in environmental issues? Are you passionate about climate science? Our Environmental and Climate Science course is designed for you.

Deepen your understanding of the environment and climate through exploration of topics such as pollution, water management and genetics. Learn about field and lab techniques as you study units in biology, chemistry, mathematics and environmental sciences.

Following this course you can pursue your interests by reading related degrees such as geology, environmental sciences, ecology or marine biology.



Access to HE Medicine

Level 3 Diploma

Start date: September

Study: Full time

Duration: 1 year

Location: Park Lane Campus

If you want to enter the medical profession or have an interest in reading biology or chemistry at degree level, this course will give you the grounding you need.

Studying in laboratories and taught by specialist tutors, you will further your knowledge of biology, chemistry and maths. Covering subjects such as organic compounds, structure and functions of the body, and applications of scientific, statistical and epidemiological problems, this interesting course prepares you for scientific study at university.

As well as deepening your medical knowledge, this one year course also concentrates on improving your academic report writing, equipping you with the skills you will need in order to learn at a higher level.

Progression following this course includes reading medicine, medical sciences, biology or chemistry based degrees.

Access to HE Science

Level 3 Diploma

Start date: September

Study: Full time

Duration: 1 year

Location: Park Lane Campus

If you are a keen scientist or are wanting to pursue a career in science, our access course could see you starting a science degree in just one year.

Covering a fascinating range of biology and chemistry modules, ranging from infection and immunity to energy and equilibria, you will further your scientific knowledge. You will also improve your academic skills such as referencing and academic writing. To ensure you are ready for degree-level study you will develop your mathematical skills, studying algebra, logarithms, statistics and calculus.

Following completion of this course you can embark upon a scientific degree and pursue careers in pharmacy, biomedical science and nutrition.

5 GCSE Pathway, including English and Maths

If you plan on pursuing a new career or further study but don't have the qualifications to do so, our Access Foundation (five GCSEs) or Fast-Track Science GCSE (combined) courses can help.

Access Foundation (five GCSEs)

Work towards gaining passes in five GCSEs, including English Language, maths and science. Lessons are spread out across three full days and as well as subject-specific study, you will also strengthen your academic skills, such as writing and presenting.

Fast-Track Science GCSE (Combined)

This exciting double GCSE science award combines biology, chemistry and physics. It is ideal if you require science GCSEs to progress into primary teaching, nursing or a scientific Level 3 route. Morning and evening classes are available and your studies will be split between classroom and home study.

Please note, to be eligible for this course you will need a minimum grade 4 in GCSE maths and a minimum grade 3 in English.

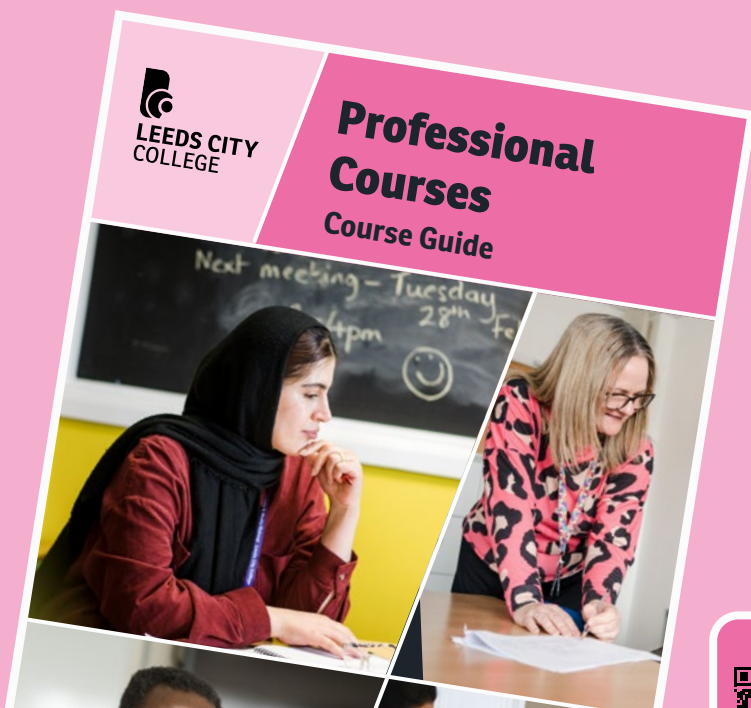
