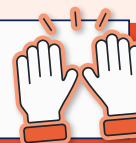

- ◆ **Proven Blueprint for Success:** Since 2021, LTHT has supported over 103 students, actively addressing workforce vacancies through the dedicated Future You career pathways in the region.

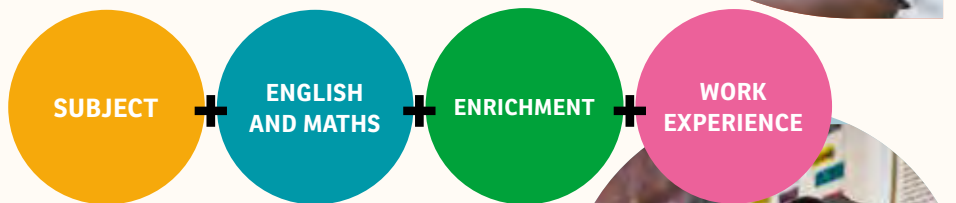

How We Will Support You

Student Information Hub

Our Student Information Hub is our central online system where you can find all the help and resources you need. Jam-packed with useful information from writing CVs to maintaining wellbeing, whatever you need, the Hub is the perfect starting place.

Academic Support

You will receive **dedicated academic support** from your teachers and coaching tutors. Additionally, the iLearn team is available for **skills training, 1:1 advice, workshops, learning materials and exam preparation sessions**. Our Independent Learning Zones give access to a range of books, Google Chromebooks, CDs, DVDs and more.

Careers Support

Once you're a student with us, you can access additional career or progression support. Our Careers, Work Experience & Progression team in Student Life can provide advice and connect you with career advisers. We can help you **prepare for university, find an apprenticeship, discover relevant job roles, write a CV, develop employability skills** and more.



Tutorials

All students take part in tutorial sessions covering **personal, social, health and citizenship topics**, shaped by current issues and real-world themes. These sessions help students build the skills and confidence they need for their future careers, while also learning how to stay safe and look after their wellbeing.



Relational Practice

Relational practice is the approach we take to teach you how to deal with difficult situations, overcome challenges and build strong, positive relationships. Using the power of communication, community building and conflict resolution, you will be equipped with the skills to help recognise and resolve issues as they arise.



Safeguarding

Safeguarding is at the centre of all we do, helping to ensure all students feel safe, respected and protected from harm. Whether it's concern for yourself, or for others, online, in college or at home, our staff are trained to recognise and respond to any concerns. Whatever you're going through, our dedicated team of Stay Safe Officers and Designated Safeguarding Officers are trained to listen, understand and support.

Prevent

Negotiating today's world can be challenging at times. At college you will meet and learn with people of different opinions and beliefs. You will develop your ability to think critically and we will teach you to challenge extremist views. To do this, we follow government guidance, which is known as the Prevent duty.

Equality, Diversity and Inclusion (EDI)

Equality, diversity and inclusion (EDI) is woven into the culture here at Leeds City College. We foster a welcoming climate of respect and dignity, actively challenge prejudice and work within the spirit of the Equality Act of 2010. Mental Health Support

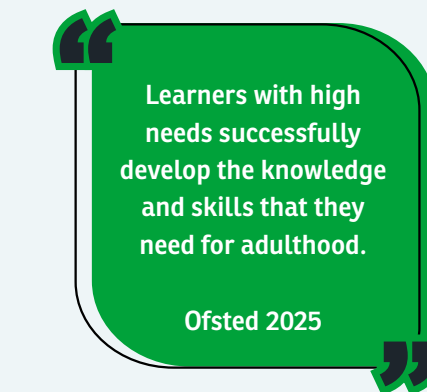
Support with exams

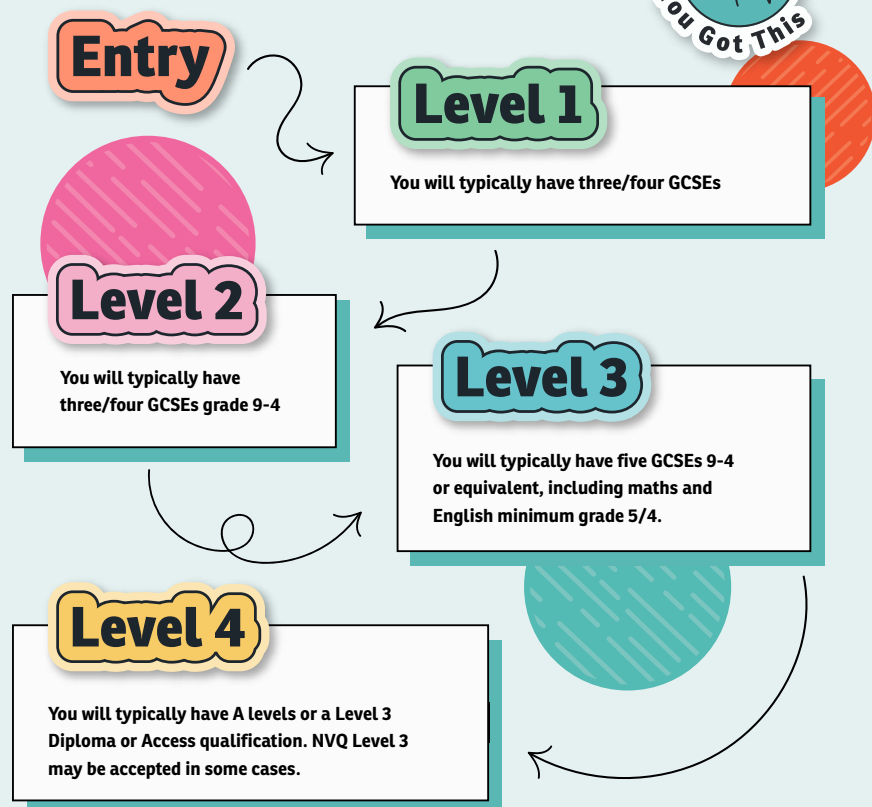

We offer a wide range of courses and qualifications for which entry requirements can differ.

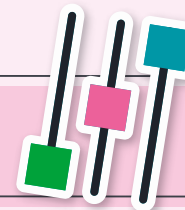

Your Options

Vocational Courses/BTECs

Designed around the needs of each industry, vocational courses allow you to **specialise in your chosen subject**, learning essential theory and gaining valuable **practical skills** to help you pursue your dream career.

Available from **Levels 1 to 3** (subject dependent), once completed you can progress to **further study, higher education, apprenticeships or employment**. From aviation to graphic design, health and social care to engineering, we offer vocational courses in a vast range of subjects.



T Levels

T Levels are a two-year course, **equivalent to three A levels**. They combine academic study with industry experience: **80% classroom learning and 20% work placement**.

Taught by tutors with **industry experience**, you'll gain essential skills and **in-depth knowledge of your chosen sector** while completing at least 45 days on a placement with a local employer. Following your T Level, you'll be ready to step into **skilled employment, a higher apprenticeship or a degree**.

T-LEVELS



A Levels

A levels are academic qualifications for 16 to 19-year-olds that can lead to university, employment or an apprenticeship. These courses can be studied at Leeds Sixth Form College and Pudsey Sixth Form College.

With A levels, as you study **multiple subjects**, you can specialise towards a chosen career path while keeping your options open. You'll demonstrate the capability of **academic writing, theoretical and practical study** as you prepare for **exam assessment**.
